

*The HS directory is much thinner than past years because there is a lot of information about admissions requirements that isn't show.


To find admissions requirements for each high school that you are considering, please follow the instructions below:


• Scroll all the way to the bottom and click on "school directory"




• Click on "High School"

 - Example: Bard High School




Once you click on "Bard High School Early College Queens" this is what you will see:



At the bottom, you will see the school name listed again with a star next to it. Click on it and you will find the admissions requirements for the school and their specific programs:




Read all about the school – read each part, you will find valuable information.
